Mayor Wissman called for a motion to adjourn. Alderman Thompson made a motion to adjourn. Alderman Harmon seconded the motion.



3 MAYOR WISSMAN: So on to new
4 business. This is Item 4-1, off-premise beer
5 permit violation for 40 Airline Road located at
6 50 -- or 40 Airline -- excuse me -- located at
7 5055 Airline Road, Arlington, Tennessee.

8 Mr. Lawson, we'll turn this over to you

9 MR. LAWSON: Yeah. This is a
10 violation for 5055 Airline Road for sale of beer
11 to underaged minor. The -- this was a sting
12 operation. We do not have a Shelby County
13 officer here to testify today. The defendant's
14 attorney is here, Mr. Price. We -- he is -- we
15 have previously spoken about the matter. I
16 believe they can address any questions.

17 This is for a sale of a 16-ounce Seagrams
18 Escape. The -- as you'll see in your
19 application, the report provides any information
20 that the officer would normally testify, and this
21 is the third violation.

22 In your packet, you'll see the two
23 previous violations, one in 2013, one in 2014.
24 The 2013 violation had a \$1,000 fine. The 2014

1 had a \$2500 fine issued by this Board.

2 Mr. Price represents the defendant. They
3 don't have to testify. They're willing to
4 stipulate to the charges?

5 MR. HARRIS: That is correct. And
6 may it please the Board, good evening. I am
7 Price Harris. My address is 212 Adams, Memphis
8 Tennessee. I am here on behalf of the permit
9 holder. Ms. Meghani is present as well.

10 We would like to go ahead and move this
11 matter forward, and thank you for continuing it
12 in August to let me have time to go through this
13 with them.

14 We would stipulate to the facts, as
15 Mr. Lawson has said already. But I would like to
16 give an explanation before the Board makes a
17 determination as what the punishment might be.
18 And by way of doing it, if I could take you back
19 briefly to April 28th about 2:00 in the morning.
20 It's pitch dark, and a truck approaches Forty
21 Airline. It's just up the road here. It's over
22 there (indicating) right by the interstate. The
23 truck pulls on to the lot right around 2:00
24 o'clock in the morning, makes a circle, leaves,

1 comes back later, backs up to the big glass doors
2 where you enter the business with. They back up,
3 break the doors, run inside and throw a tow rope
4 around an ATM machine. And there's a reason I'm
5 telling you this, too. They try to then pull the
6 ATM out by hitting the gas and taking off. The
7 rope snaps, and off they go. I don't believe
8 they ever caught the person or persons trying to
9 do this, but it damaged the business greatly.

10 Move forward to when the alarms have gone
11 off. The owners have been notified. They're
12 trying to secure the business to make sure no one
13 else comes back in for the rest of the night.
14 The staff comes in the next morning to work, and
15 things are very chaotic. They're trying to get
16 the business secured. They're trying to conduct
17 business, and they're also trying to have someone
18 come in to fix the door frames.

19 In the process of doing this, around -- I
20 think Mr. Lawson and I determined 8:00 o'clock
21 that night. And I did take the liberty of
22 getting the incident report. If anyone would
23 like to read it, I'd be happy to pass it forward.

24 An undercover agent working for the

1 sheriff's deputy that came in that night tried to
2 make a purchase, and was able to pass a \$20 bill
3 to the clerk, and got change for it, went out.
4 The Sheriff's deputy came back in, as I
5 understood the facts from looking into this as
6 well, and said, look, we made the purchase.
7 Here's your -- we want our change back. Here's
8 your 20. And this young man right here -- stand
9 up, Brandon -- was the clerk at the time, and
10 we've asked to bring him in case the Board had
11 any questions as to what was going on at that
12 time.

13 The reason I'm going through this with
14 you -- you may think, why are you telling me this
15 crazy story? We have a violation. But looking
16 at the record for this business, this is a third
17 violation. It's a very serious matter. It's one
18 they do not take lightly. There is an
19 explanation as to why things were so chaotic, and
20 I just felt it incumbent upon myself as the
21 attorney representing the permit holder to share
22 this with you so you wouldn't think this is just
23 something that they just did Willy-nilly. This
24 is not their normal course of business. They

1 have had prior violations. They have been some
2 years ago. They have taken steps to try to
3 educate their staff to let them learn what the
4 rules are, to make sure they follow the rules as
5 best as possible.

6 And may I add, also, since that time when
7 this violation occurred, they have also sent part
8 of their staff through a class through the
9 Justice Network. And if you're not familiar with
10 the Justice Network, it's a local probation
11 company that provides different types of classes,
12 one of which is a serving alcohol responsibly
13 class. I have a copy of the three that have
14 already gone through there, with their receipts
15 of that. Brandon himself has already gone
16 through and completed the class. Of course, he
17 received a misdemeanor citation that night for
18 the sale. His matter has been concluded, and was
19 disposed of because he had participated in the
20 class. And so that leaves us with the violation
21 that we have right now.

22 Also, I've met with Mr. Lawson. And
23 after that meeting, I've also stressed to the
24 Meghanis -- and they've taken the advice -- to go

1 through the State ABC program for a Responsible
2 Vendor Program. They have made application to
3 the program. They are -- it's my understanding
4 from Ms. Meghani and Mr. Meghani telling me they
5 are enrolled in that program now.

6 And what I want to point out to the Board
7 is, yes, there's a violation. They have taken, I
8 hope you see, steps, not just to ignore this and
9 let it go away, but to try to make sure that this
10 doesn't happen again. They're very apologetic
11 this happened. They would not contest a fine in
12 this matter, if the Board saw fit, of \$2500. And
13 Ms. Meghani's in the position to go ahead and
14 secure that fine and get it paid forthwith.

15 Now, if the Board felt that wasn't strong
16 enough to send another message, and felt a
17 suspension was in order, we would ask the Board
18 to consider nothing more than 30 days because
19 this is a great benefit to them to have for this
20 business, and I think that you well know that a
21 beer permit is a very viable part of a business,
22 and it also returns back to the community in the
23 form of tax revenue.

24 With that said, I'm happy to answer any

1 questions that you may have, as the Board. If
2 not, I have Ms. Meghani on standby, and we can
3 present any of these people if you have
4 questions. Thank you for your time.

5 MAYOR WISSMAN: Mr. Lawson?

6 MR. LAWSON: Speaking with
7 Mr. Harris, and reviewing the situation, and
8 reviewing the prior history and what we've done
9 previously, my recommendation would be for a
10 30-day suspension from this Board at this time
11 for a third violation. Even though the two
12 previous matters have been 2013, 2014, I think my
13 recommendation would be a 30-day suspension to
14 the Board at this time.

15 MAYOR WISSMAN: You've heard the
16 recommendation of Mr. Lawson. Do I have a motion
17 to approve?

18 MR. HARRY MCKEE: Motion.

19 MAYOR WISSMAN: Motion by Mr. McKee.
20 Second?

21 MR. HARMON: Second.

22 MAYOR WISSMAN: Second by Mr. Harmon.
23 Discussion or questions for either Mr. Harmon
24 (sic), Mr. Price or the tenants?

1 MR. THOMPSON: I have a few
2 questions.

3 MR. HARRIS: Sure.

4 MR. THOMPSON: Are you aware or can
5 anyone recall from the first or second
6 violations, was it suggested or advised at that
7 time to join the Responsible Vendor Program by
8 this Board?

9 MR. HARRIS: I do not have personal
10 knowledge of that. I will say I talked to
11 Mr. Lawson, and I believe that was part of the
12 conversation. It was suggested that, perhaps,
13 they would go through that. They have --

14 MR. THOMPSON: It typically is
15 something that we certainly advise and recommend.
16 So it's certainly unfortunate that they did not
17 decide to do that until a third violation
18 occurred.

19 And another question I have is with
20 regards to a point-of-sale system. From looking
21 at the receipt, it does not appear that it's a
22 point-of-sale system that requires a birthday be
23 entered for a valid sale. I would personally
24 recommend that perhaps they consider a system

1 that requires a valid birth date be entered
2 before an alcohol sale be required (sic). That's
3 just one way to try to, you know, discourage that
4 in the future.

5 MR. HARRIS: That's a good point.
6 Mr. Lawson and I talked about that because,
7 initially, the concern was there had been a false
8 birthday put into the system. And I told
9 Mr. Lawson, I don't think that's the case. And
10 upon checking, that was not the case. But
11 certainly, that'd put a whole different spin on
12 this had that been the case.

13 MR. THOMPSON: And while, certainly,
14 you know, it's definitely unfortunate the
15 incident occurred earlier in that day, I
16 personally feel like when -- when there's a lot
17 of commotion, you may forget to do things that
18 you're -- that are not a part of your regular
19 routine, but they were a part, habitual, and part
20 of regular operations you would not forget.

21 So I feel like that that attitude should
22 start at the top, and filter its way down. And
23 Mr. Davis obviously made a mistake. That's
24 unfortunate, but I would like -- you know, hope

1 that going forward, that the attitude is set at
2 the very top of the ownership, and perhaps some
3 regular system be put in place to prevent it in
4 the future. And it's just a suggestion and a
5 recommendation.

6 MR. HARRIS: All great points, and I
7 think well taken, too. I think that --
8 hopefully, what we were trying to show earlier is
9 that they are taking steps to --

10 MR. THOMPSON: Sure.

11 MR. HARRIS: -- prevent this from
12 happening. This may be very well something they
13 integrate into this.

14 MR. THOMPSON: Yeah.

15 MR. HARRIS: It may be as simple as a
16 module to the POS system they have. I don't know
17 what they're running --

18 MR. THOMPSON: Perhaps, yeah.

19 MR. HARRIS: -- but it could be they
20 just add that as a component on it.

21 MR. THOMPSON: All right.

22 MR. HARRIS: I know a lot of those
23 are buildable systems.

24 MR. THOMPSON: Okay. Thank you.

1 MR. HARRIS: Yes. Thank you.

2 MR. HARRY MCKEE: To answer your
3 question that they were asking. Of course, they
4 met with Cathy afterwards, but -- about -- well,
5 I ask that question on just about everyone that
6 comes because of the importance of it. I'm not
7 asking you to re-join that. It's just: Are you
8 going to make some things better? You know, the
9 commotion he's talking about, did the same
10 commotion happen the first two times or did it
11 not? Do you know?

12 MR. HARRIS: I don't think they had a
13 break-in --

14 MR. HARRY MCKEE: Probably not.

15 MR. HARRIS: -- I hope. I mean, it
16 could have. I hope not.

17 MR. HARRY MCKEE: That tells you
18 something. If you look back, you know, there's
19 some time in between each one, but they don't
20 come but about once a year or so. We'd rather
21 not see them every year.

22 MR. HARRIS: I think they share that
23 sentiment as well.

24 MAYOR WISSMAN: Any other discussion

1 or questions from -- for any of the attorneys?

2 MR. LAMAR: I had one question, I
3 guess.

4 MR. HARRIS: Yes.

5 MR. LAMA: At the point of sale when
6 the event happened, was there a lot of customers
7 in line? Was there a lot of rushing going on?

8 MR. HARRIS: Let's ask Brandon about
9 that.

10 Brandon, if you'll come up. You can
11 address that.

12 (Whereupon, Mr. Brandon Davis
13 approaches the podium.)

14 MR. BRANDON DAVIS: Hey. I'm
15 Brandon. Yeah, there was. When they -- it was a
16 younger African-American female, and then a -- I
17 don't believe it was a Shelby County. It was
18 part of the -- I don't -- one of their task force
19 that deals with --

20 MR. HARRIS: Uh-huh, (affirmative
21 response).

22 MR. BRANDON DAVIS: -- it was the
23 young female, and then the officer behind her,
24 and then five or six customers behind her, and

1 then customers coming in and out.

2 And that was the -- the biggest part of
3 what the problem was, is that it just happened,
4 and our -- not alarm -- but every time the door
5 opens, it lets you know that somebody had just
6 opened the door -- just opened it, and somebody
7 was coming in the store.

8 Well, when they broke down the door, it
9 didn't do that anymore, and it was pretty much
10 just a big plywood door right there that was open
11 so customers could come in and out. So it was
12 between being busy, and people in line, and then
13 trying to watch the door, and watch through the
14 store and make sure nobody was taking anything,
15 and trying to keep hand on who was coming in and
16 out of the store, and making sure you were
17 notified of who was in there at all times, and...

18 I mean, it -- it was a honest mistake. I
19 can't make an excuse for that. But it was just a
20 lot on hand for -- you know, to be trying to
21 watch the entire store, and then do all that at
22 one time.

23 MR. LAMAR: Okay. Thank you.

24 MAYOR WISSMAN: Any other questions

1 or comments from this Board?

2 MR. HARMON: I guess the main thing
3 that we're really wanting y'all to understand is
4 the gravity of the situation.

5 MR. HARRIS: Certainly.

6 MR. HARMON: Circumstances will
7 always happen. But when you possibly sell beer
8 to an underage person, who, in turn, is going to
9 be getting in a car, you know, we're talking
10 about setting up for tragedy.

11 MR. HARRIS: I totally agree. I'm
12 friends with Tim Dwyer downtown. And every
13 person that comes before Tim with a DUI gets a
14 copy of a news article, and that news article
15 goes back for a long while. But it was his
16 cousin that was killed in Germantown along
17 Dogwood Road, and it was a drunk driver. It was
18 Mr. Somogyi's son, Judge Dwyer's cousin, and I
19 think a third person as well.

20 And to this day, Tim still brings them up
21 there and hands it. Says, I want you to take
22 this. I want you to read this. I mean, he just
23 -- he just -- every time he goes on there. He
24 just doesn't let them pass. But it's sort of

1 become a legacy for him with his cousin.

2 MR. HARMON: Yes.

3 MR. PRICE: And it's laudable. He's
4 taken such a tragedy but been able to work Drug
5 Court, and helping other people. That point's
6 not lost on me. I can assure you that.

7 MR. HARMON: We can -- we know that
8 the circumstances -- you know, we'll -- getting
9 busy, and certain things will happen, but it's
10 our job to impress upon them to take every step
11 possible --

12 MR. HARRIS: Understood.

13 MR. HARMON: -- because our job is to
14 prevent the tragedies.

15 MR. HARRIS: Right. Thank you.

16 MAYOR WISSMAN: Any other questions
17 or comments?

18 (No verbal response)

19 MAYOR WISSMAN: Seeing none. All in
20 favor of the motion, say, aye.

21 (Whereupon, all board members vote:
22 Aye.)

23 MAYOR WISSMAN: Opposed?

24 (No verbal responses)

1 MAYOR WISSMAN: That item passes.

2 MR. HARRIS: Thank you. It's a
3 pleasure to see all of you.

4 MAYOR WISSMAN: For the record, do we
5 need to clarify that? We had the motion, but it
6 was 30 days.

7 MR. LAWSON: The motion was a 30-day
8 suspension, correct?

9 MS. DURANT: Correct.

10 MR. PRICE: Thank y'all very much.
11 Appreciate you letting me come before the Board
12 tonight.

13 MAYOR WISSMAN: Thank you very much.
14 Any other business?

15 MS. OWENS: No, sir.

16 MAYOR WISSMAN: Seeing none, do I
17 have a motion to adjourn the meeting?

18 MR. THOMPSON: Motion to adjourn.

19 MR. HARMON: Second.

20 MAYOR WISSMAN: Motion by
21 Mr. Thompson, second by Commissioner Harmon.
22 That item passes.
